Using action research as a youth work tool in turn leading to an effective method leading to positive change.
<b>Managing Change</b> Role and influence of culture and climate in organisations, consequences of change on organisations, communities and individuals. Managing change.
<b>European models of youth work.</b> Exploration and analysis of other models of delivery - taking climate, environment, client group, effectiveness as analysis pieces.
<b>Government Structures.</b> Organisation of government. House of the Oireachtas, Seanad and European Parliament. Decision making and impact.
<b>Community context of youth work.</b> Professional worker and the volunteer. Local level structures and partnerships. Issues in community sector. Exploration of youth work as 'political' and politics at local level and community level.
